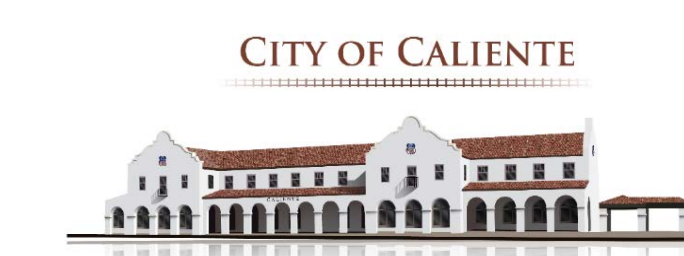
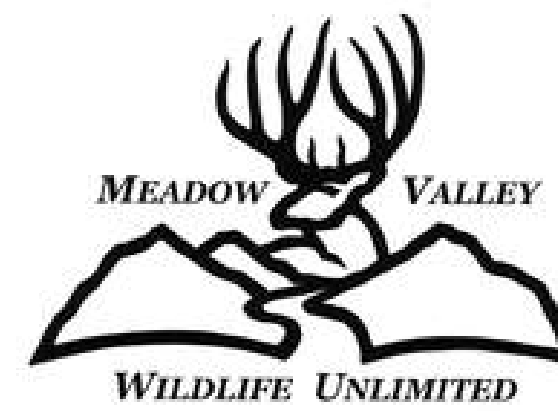

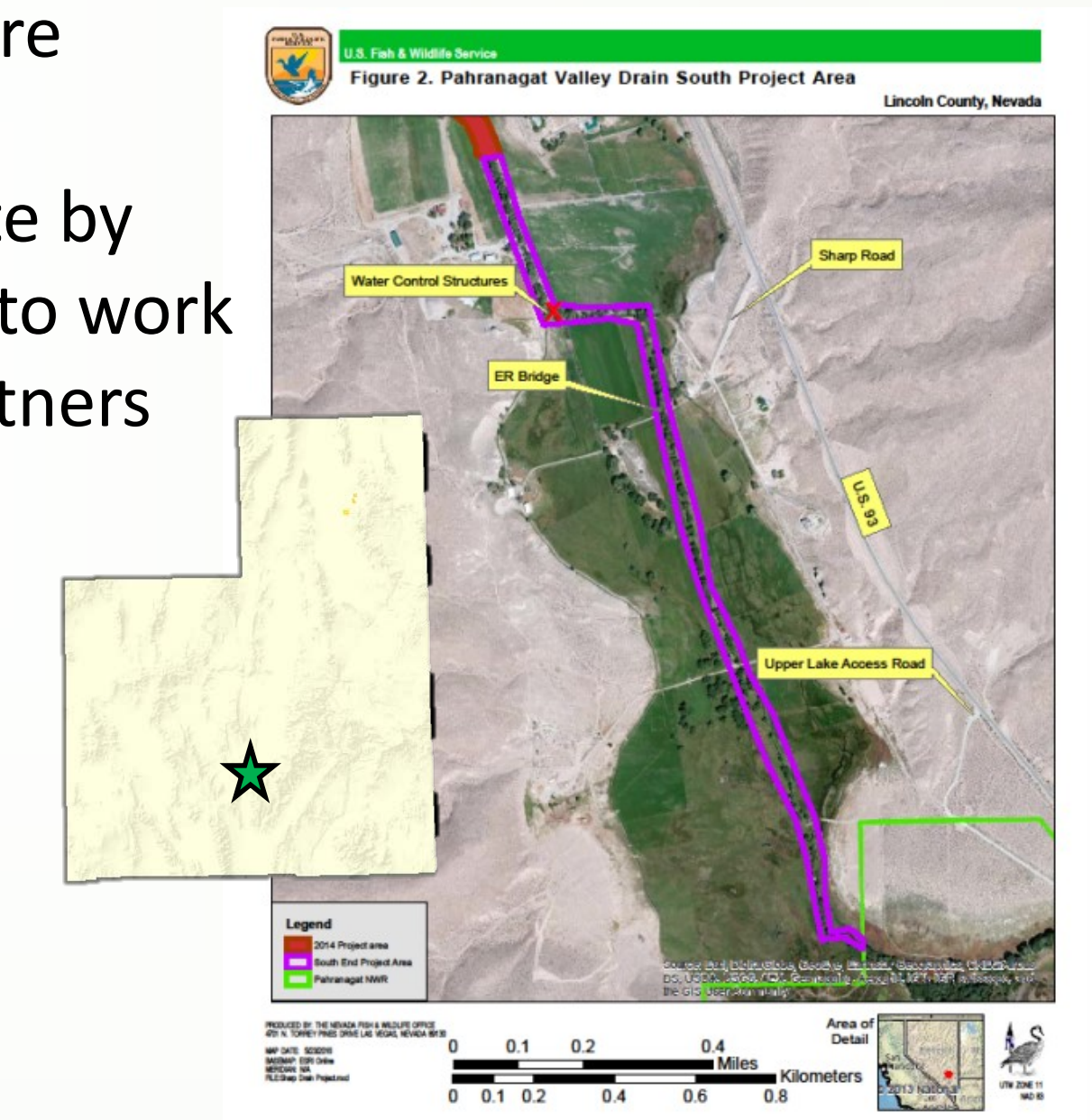
Beaver Dam Analog Project

Installing structures designed to mimic the function of a natural beaver dam along Wilson Creek to increase stream meanders; this keeps water on the land longer, traps sediment, holds groundwater, and deters animal use – all of which begins to restore meadow function.



Pahrnagat Drain Cleaning Project

Track hoes used to clean the Drain were provided by City of Caliente and Ash Meadows NWR were hauled to the site by the Lincoln County Road Department to work on the CD project, paid by USFWS Partners program. This cooperative work is ongoing with available funding.
